### **Sunday, September 9 Mingling of the Waters Moderated by Alan Lando**

We begin the 2018/19 church year with our traditional Unitarian Universalist Mingling of the Waters Ceremony. Each person brings water from a vacation, weekend away, from the Mississippi or just from the home tap to combine in a large bowl, symbolizing our separation during the summer and our reunion again in the fall. ### **Sunday, September 16 Journey Through a Land of Extreme Poverty: Welcome to America Presented by Alan Lando**

Dr. Lando will base his talk on the findings of Philip Alston, the United Nations special rapporteur on extreme poverty and human rights, who wrote on his observations in the US. Despite the fact that we are one of the richest countries in the world, millions of US citizens continue to live in dire poverty. This talk will describe the circumstances of these individuals and will then consider our obligations and strategies for addressing this human rights tragedy.

(Harry) Alan Lando is Distinguished International Professor in the School of Public Health at the University of Minnesota. His research has focused primarily on treating tobacco dependence and he has been a strong advocate for combating the

global tobacco epidemic. Alan is a long time member of Groveland Fellowship, and is president for this church year.

### **Sunday, September 23 Darwin and Religion Presented by Bruce Jarvis**

Charles Darwin and the Theory of Evolution by Natural Selection have been the targets of pious people for over a century. The latest critics are those who believe in intelligent design. Little known is that Darwin was educated to become a prelate.

Bruce Jarvis, PhD teaches general biology and microbiology at Normandale and Carleton Community Colleges. Bruce is a member of Groveland Fellowship.

### **Sunday, September 30 Nationalism VS Globalism: The New Political Divide Presented by Huron Smith**

Groveland member Huron Smith will present a talk about group size: What aggregation is required for effective problem solving going forward in time? Discussion among us of this theme will be kicked off watching the first 20 minutes of the YouTube video of the same name, located at

We will try to sidestep the problem of developing "fake news" by providing an approach to answering the question rather than providing the answer itself.

Huron Smith taught economics and finance at Central Michigan University. Born in Massachusetts, he lived two years in Bolivia and has visited over forty countries. He was an officer of two technology startups in Madison, Wisconsin. He is interested in the social consequences of income inequality.

### **Love Reaches Out Workshop Offered**

Phil Lund from MidAmerican Region of the UUA is planning 2 or more workshops titled *Love Reaches Out* this coming year (one is scheduled for October 13). Groveland Fellowship members are invited to attend.

Here is a description of the workshop, combined from the UUA study guide and from Phil Lund:

*Love Reaches Out* is a three workshop study guide (it can be offered in three different sessions or all on one day) that helps us understand how the American religious landscape is changing and how UU congregations can respond to that reality, examine who we are as Unitarian Universalists, both in our congregations and as a faith movement, and whether we are effectively communicating this to the wider world. One way to achieve this is by offering events, programs and opportunities to introduce UUs to their communities. Another is through a shared UU "brand identity" in

communications, helping shape how Unitarian Universalists are perceived. The workshop would help us develop a plan for getting started with our congregation or group by reaching out into the community while staying grounded in our core identity or mission.

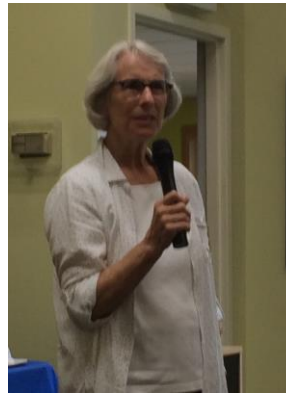
