This month's book group selection is *Democracy in Chains*, by Nancy MacLean. Behind today's headlines of billionaires taking over our government is a secretive political establishment with long, deep, and troubling roots. The capitalist radical right has been working not simply to change who

rules, but to fundamentally alter the rules of democratic governance. But billionaires did not launch this movement; a white intellectual in the embattled Jim Crow South did. *Democracy in Chains* names its true architect—the Nobel Prize-winning political economist James McGill Buchanan—and dissects the operation he and his colleagues designed over six decades to alter every branch of government to disempower the majority. Accessibility

Sara Leiste attended a Midwest Region webinar about accessibility for churches. Here are some suggestions from the webinar:

- Provide large print orders of service.
- Label food if the ingredients are not obvious.
- Minimize use of perfumes or other scents.
- Be willing to move or rearrange chairs to make it easier for people with wheelchairs or other mobility aids. Ask people where they'd like to sit, rather than insisting that they sit in the place that is easiest to move chairs.
