### **Flower Communion**

one places a flower in a shared vase. During the service, the moderator guides the fellowship so that the flowers are redistributed. Each person takes home a flower brought by someone else – thus symbolizing our shared celebration in community. This communion of sharing is essential to a free people of a free religion.

## Explanation of Two New Budget Items

### 1) Recommendation to support Interfaith Action of Greater Saint Paul:

The Executive Committee of Groveland UU Fellowship recommends that we support Interfaith Action of Greater Saint Paul by paying a basic annual membership fee of \$100 starting July 1, 2019. This move is meant to signify solidarity with the nonprofit organization that has provided us a relatively low-cost place to hold our Sunday service for 25 plus years now, and whose mission and programs are compatible with our fellowship's covenant. Interfaith Action's mission is "...to unite the people, resources and voice of the faith community to build a more just, safe, equitable and livable Greater Saint Paul for all". Its programs "...provide critically needed shelter for families, free legal assistance, and emergency services related to food, clothing and transportation." At the same time, it seeks "... systemic solutions to reduce poverty through programs focused on high-impact volunteering, advanced understanding of the causes of poverty, and cultural and religious awareness and tolerance." ### 2) Recommendation to support the Minnesota Unitarian Universalist Social Justice Alliance

For the first time in MUUSJA's history it is asking each of the UU congregations across Minnesota to provide annual support. MUUSJA is requesting Groveland UU Fellowship to contribute \$5.00 per member before the end of 2019 and annually after that. This would mean a \$125 addition to our budget.
