The Flower Communion service was created by Norbert Capek (1870-1942) who founded the Unitarian Church in Czechoslovakia. He felt

the need for some symbolic ritual that would bind people more closely together.

Congregants are asked to bring a flower of their choice, from their gardens, the roadside, or flower shop. Each person upon arrival places their flower in a vase at the front of the room, symbolizing the larger fellowship.
