(Online Zoom from home only) Speaker: Rev. Dr. Qiyamah Rahman Moderator: Rose Dorer



Rev. Dr. Rahman resides in St. Croix, Virgin Islands. From 2012 to 2018 she served the UU Fellowship of St. Croix. She has graciously agreed to share with us (via Zoom) her reflections and insights

on the history and presence of Black Americans in UUism. Her unique observations are gleaned from 31 years as a UU, 16 years as a UU minister, and almost 30 years thinking about, researching and writing about Black UU women and girls. Currently, she is a full-time volunteer Executive Director of Sister Source, Inc., an inclusive non-profit organization she founded that is dedicated to serving Black UU women and girls.

Rev. Dr. Rahman earned her bachelor's degree in education and her masters of

social work from the University of Michigan. She also holds a Master of Divinity degree from Meadville Lombard Theological School, and a Doctor of Arts in Africana Women's Studies from Clark Atlanta University.

Using a 21st Century perspective on the original Varieties of Religious Experience by William James, this presentation—given by one of the most influential neuroscientists today—explores the most recent

research and knowledge about the many varieties of spiritual experiences. These experiences and their elements can be related to specific aspects of brain function, shown using some of the latest brain scan studies. Overall, this presentation provides a thorough and modern perspective on the varieties of spiritual experiences. Dr. Newberg has been particularly involved in the study of mystical and religious experiences, a field referred to as "neurotheology". He has published over 250 peer-reviewed articles on brain function, brain imaging, and the study of religious and mystical experiences.
